CANDLELIGHT PROCESSION

Two caskets holding the Buddha Relic and Arahant Sivali Relic will be mounted and carried in two individual palanquins during the candlelight procession.

The procession will go three times round the temple's premises. The procession comprises individuals carrying the Singapore flag, Buddhist flag and Mangala Vihara flag, the Sun, the Dhammacakka and the Moon signs, girls carrying flowers baskets sprinkling flowers, ladies carrying flower bouquets, Sunday Dhamma students children carrying Buddhist flags and members and devotees holding yellow candles and joss-sticks.

Upon completion, all candles and joss-sticks will be placed on candle racks and sand boxes at the Bodhi shrine. Then proceed to the Shrine Hall for blessing and transferring of merits.
